Empirical Data - Empirical statements contain factual or objective statements

Objective - not influenced by personal feelings or opinions in considering and representing facts

Normative Data - Normative statements contain subjective or value-related judgments

Subjective - Based on or influenced by personal feelings, tastes, or opinions
