
Von Thunen Model

- This model explains the development of agricultural towns and cities.



Layer 1 Market:


The place where goods are bought and sold




Layer 2 Horticulture and Dairying:

Milk products, fruits, and vegetables have short shelf lives so need to be located close to city
Difficult to transport

Layer 3 Forestry:



Ring of trees to provide building materials and firewood



Layer 4 Grain and Mixed Crop:

Large scale farms that allow for growing large amounts of food.
Usually lighter but bulkier so more difficult to transport than animals



Layer 5
Ranching and
Livestock:

Large areas for farm animals.
Animals can walk themselves to market
