



1. How would a symbolic sociologist view the Burga? Explain your answer?




2. How would a functional sociologist view the Burqa? Explain your answer

"I think wearing Burqa is nothing but a shame to our whole nation and such a huge violence toward women. It was first brought by Taliban, we never had such a thing in our culture and history before. It is obvious that women who wear burqas do not do it by their own choice or understanding, they have been forced to wear them and obey the men of the family. Even though, it has been almost removed from Kabul, there are other provinces still using them and it makes me really angry and dishonored."
