


#### Critical Thinking Question

 B.C.E.) below were made. Explain the process you believe the ancient Chinese went through to make the vessels.



# Piece Mold Casting

- Clay molds were made and molten bronze was poured into the mold.
- Once it dried the molds were removed and any appendages were added



#### **Bronze Working Impacts**

- Bronze age lasted from 1700 B.C.E. until 400 B.C.E.
  - Independent of Mesopotamia and India
- Shows an organized societal structure
  - Labor division and an artisan class
- Chinese tradition of presentation and displays of wealth/social status
  - Highly ornamented serving vessels

#### **Shang China Artistic Tradition**

- Artists worked in Jade and Bronze to make functional and ornamental works to adorn homes
  - Show a high level of sophistication and craftsmanship

### Ornamentation



## Ornamentation

- Flowing and fluid design structure
  - Shapes flow into each other
  - Often depicting real and imaginary figures
    - Abstract or Realistic

# Jade Carving

- Required highly skilled carvers
  - Could not cut with steel, had to be sanded away using harder stones (quartz)
  - Led to very smooth surfaces
- Jade imported from Central Asia
  - Great value and possible magic properties

   Probably from
   Anyang, Henan
   Province, China
- Medium: Earthenware
