3.	What were the short-term and long-term effects of the plague? (Explain one of each)
4.	Explain two of the significant impacts of the Church (or monasteries) during the dark ages.
5.	Explain one of the effects of the Viking incursions onto the European Continent. Also one effect of the Crusades on Europe.
6.	Explain the perceived reasoning for referring to the era between the fall of Rome and the Renaissance as the "Dark Ages."
