

Directions: Use the College Board briefing paper on Nigeria (pages 1-18) to create a presentation regarding the history of Nigeria and the formation of its government?

Step 1: Examine the College Board briefing paper on Nigeria (Linked on the course website) and read some of the major points. State finding which sections specifically deal with each of the questions below.

Step 2: Create a Presentation (Powerpoint, Google Presentation) about the formation of Nigeria's government that answers the following questions

- 1. What events in Nigeria's past have shaped their attitudes towards government?
 - o List and explain
- 2. What was Biafra and why was it so important in the formation of modern Nigeria?
- 3. Who are some of the influential leaders and political parties that have helped form the government?
- 4. What effect has Nigeria's ethnicities and religions had on the unification of the country?
 - Make sure your explanation includes descriptions of the factors involved.
- 5. What influence did outside countries have on the culture, development, and history of Nigeria?
- 6. Why is Nigeria such a good example of a Procedural/ Electoral Authoritarian state to study?
- Your presentation can be made in groups no larger than 3 students
