

# Principles of Islamic Art





## Four Main Styles of Islamic Art

- Geometric
  - Designs based on mathematical shapes
- Calligraphic
  - Uses Arabic script as the focal point of a design.
- Organic/figural
  - Characterized by curving lines, human, animal, and flora
- Medallions
  - Normally contains a central image as the focal point


## The Image of Mohammad

 Unlike in other major world religions it is expressly FORBIDDEN to display images of the prophet Mohammed in artwork




#### **Dome of Selimiye Mosque**

Edirne, Turkey (completed 1575)




#### Folio from a Qur'an manuscript ca. 1180 Eastern Iran or present-day Afghanistan

## Principles of Islamic Architecture

- Domes
  - Typically a dome on a square building, with a plain tile exterior and elaborate mosaic interior
- Minaret
  - Typically located along the edges of a mosque. Used by a muezzin who sends out the call for prayer
- Arches
  - Different than prior arches. Islamic designs include the horseshoe arch, the transverse arch, the pointed arch and the cusped or multi-foil arch.
